The Bloomington Figure Skating Club is hosting the 2008 Minnesota State Figure Skating Championships on Friday, August 24 to Sunday August 26, 2007. The competition will be held at the Bloomington Ice Garden, 3600 West 98th Street in Bloomington.

One of the goals of the Minnesota State Championships is to prepare skaters for the upcoming qualifying competition season. To accomplish this, Minnesota State is run like a Regional competition. It includes such special features as 6 minute warm-ups for Juvenile and above, Regional-size skating groups, and posting of marks for all events. Additionally, this event will use the International Judging System (IJS) for Juvenile through Senior divisions. This competition is great preparation for the officials as well!

At the competition, our new Minnesota State Champions will be crowned. Besides securing their place in Minnesota skating history, these champions will also be celebrated at the annual Twin City Figure Skating Association banquet on Sunday September 16.

Additionally, the Minnesota State Champions will be featured along with our Sectional, National and International competitors at the "Celebration of Champions" in February 2008. I look forward to seeing all skaters, and their families, friends and fans at Minnesota State.



Miami University Hosts

2007 U.S. Collegiate Championships

Miami University will host the U.S. Collegiate Championships this August. The nation's top collegiate athletes will battle for medals at Goggin Ice Center, Miami's state-of-the-art, two-rink skating facility.

The 2007 U.S. Collegiate Championships will feature top junior and senior level competitors. Beginning Saturday, Aug. 4, college-aged skaters will arrive in Oxford, Ohio, for unofficial practice ice. The senior ladies qualifying round will be held on Sunday, with the short program and free skate events taking place throughout the next two days and culminating with the senior ladies free skate on Tuesday.

The university is thrilled to host this exciting event, and collegiate athletes are eager to visit another university and display higher levels on their required elements. The U.S. Collegiate Championships is the only collegiate skating event that utilizes the international judging system and typically draws competitive skaters who have participated in regional and sectional championships—and a few who have even competed at the U.S. Championships.

City of St. Paul Declares April 21 "Eliot Halverson Day!"

St. Paul, Minn., native and reigning U.S. junior men's figure skating champion Eliot Halverson, 16, received a special honor Saturday, April 21, at the St. Paul Figure Skating Club Ice Show at Richfield Ice Arena in Richfield, Minn. April 21 was proclaimed "Eliot Halverson Day" in the City of St. Paul by St. Paul Mayor Chris Coleman. Deputy Mayor Ann Mulholland delivered the proclamation following Halverson's performance in the ice show.

Halverson has won back-to-back U.S. titles, earning gold at the novice level in 2006 and again at the junior level in 2007. In doing so he's followed in the footsteps of former St. Paul Figure Skating Club skater John Lettengarver, who accomplished the same feat in 1945 and 1946. Halverson has finished third or better in more than a dozen regional, national and international figure skating competitions. Last month, he finished 10th at the 2007 World Junior Figure Skating Championships in Oberstdorf, Germany.

Halverson next moves up to the top level – senior – to compete at the 2008 U.S. Figure Skating Championships, which will be held at Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minn., Jan. 20-27, 2008.

Halverson, a high school junior, maintains a straight-A grade point average while pursuing his figure skater career. The St. Paul-native, born in Bogotá, Columbia, practices at Pleasant Arena in St. Paul. In his free time, Halverson also shares his skating talents as a U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills instructor.

Alex Johnson, Gardena Spring Trophy Bronze Medalist

Alex Johnson, current National Novice Silver Medalist and Braemar City of Lakes FSC member, represented the United States at the Gardena Spring Trophy in Ortisio Italy March 28 through April 1. Alex was awarded the Bronze Medal after placing 5th in short program and 3rd in freeskating.

Alex was invited to perform in the **Tom Collins Champions on Ice** shows at the DECC in Duluth on May 10th and the Target Center in Minneapolis on May 11th. Spectators were delighted with Alex's performances!



Team Braemar Junior Synchronized Skating Team Wins Gold Medal at 2007 Zagreb Snowflakes Trophy International Competition

Team Braemar's Junior Synchronized Skating Team won the gold medal at the 2007 Zagreb Snowflakes Trophy held in Zagreb, Croatia, March 16-17, 2007.



Team Braemar competed as Team USA, representing the United States of America and U.S. Figure Skating. They placed first in both the short program (50.21) and the freeskate (87.92), winning the overall crown with a score of 138.13 and capturing their first international gold medal.

Western Michigan University of Kalamazoo, Michigan, earned the bronze medal in the Senior Division at the Zagreb competition. Teams from Austria, Canada, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Russia, and Sweden also competed in this sixth-annual international synchronized skating competition for Novice, Junior, and Senior teams.

Team Braemar's Junior Team earned their international assignment by medaling at the 2006 U.S. Synchronized Team Skating Championships. This year the Junior Team finished in third place with a bronze-medal performance at the 2007 U.S. Synchronized Team Skating Championships held February 23-24, 2007, at the World Arena in Colorado

Springs, Colorado. As a result, they have been placed in the U.S. Figure Skating envelope system to receive another international assignment for the 2008 competitive season.

Team Braemar is a part of the Braemar-City of Lakes Figure Skating Club that operates out of Braemar Arena in Edina, Minnesota.

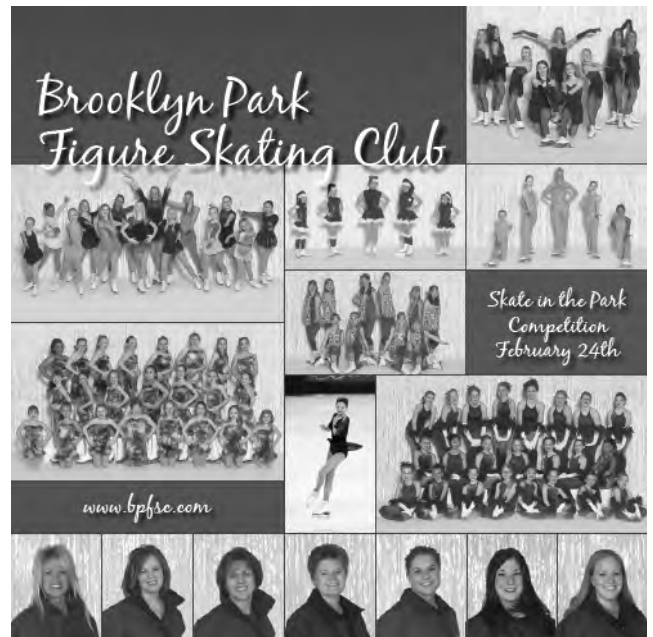

She is looking forward to competing at State and Regionals this year, and wishes to continue skating for as long as she is able to do so. Valerie simply cannot imagine her life without skating.

Valerie was born in Moscow, Russia, and moved to Hanover, New Hampshire, when she was five months old. Valerie started skating at the age of 6 with the Dartmouth Figure Skating Club. Michael McGean, a Dartmouth graduate, and 1950 World and US Ice Dance Champion, was her first figure skating coach and his wise and kind guidance helped to instill a long-lasting love of skating in Valerie.

After moving to Minnesota, Valerie was coached by Lorie Wallace for five years. Page Lipe, also a Dartmouth graduate, has been Valerie's coach for the past three and a half years. Valerie plans to continue training in skating through her Junior and Senior year of high school and in college.

Together with skating, Valerie has also been playing piano since she was five years old. This month, she became one of the four scholarship winners in the Upper Midwest Music Festival, performing in Level A at the Northwestern College. Valerie is a member of the National Honor Society and the National Art Honor Society. Valerie has a deep interest in literature, art, math, and music. In her free time, Valerie enjoys drawing, reading, listening to or playing music, and spending time with friends and family. It has been her longtime dream to be able to attend Dartmouth College one day.

Rachel graduates this year, but will be staying at Miami University in Oxford, OH, for graduate school and to work for the Miami University Athletic Department teaching skating.

Selection Process:

Award presenters will be selected by a lottery drawing to be held on August 13, 2007, following the regularly scheduled TCFSA meeting. Applications will be sorted according to TCFSA member club. One (1) skater will be drawn from each TCFSA member club. One (1) alternate will be drawn from each TCFSA member club.
